## Signing To Build A New School

On 14 July 2022 the contract between Calvary Christian College and Keswa Construction and Projects to build the new high school was signed at the school.

This is a significant milestone in the history of the school:

- In 2003, we purchased the property on which the high school is to be built.
- In 2007, we began the process of doing our environmental impact assessments and submitting these to the Gauteng Department of Agriculture and Rural Development (GDARD).
- In 2015, we finally received our approval from them and immediately submitted these to the municipality.
- In 2022, we eventually got the go ahead to begin the construction of the high school.

The process has taken us 15 years!!

Since 2006 when our first grade 7s and 8s enrolled in the school, the high school has been accommodated on the primary school property. Despite being limited in space, the high school has grown to over 200 learners, and our learners have continued to obtain a 100% matric pass rate.

The high school is due to be completed in August next year and will have, amongst its features:

- A media center
- A sit down canteen / tuckshop
- A computer center
- A full 400 meter athletics track
- A science laboratory
- A full size soccer field and new netball court.
- A 300 seater hall

As we reflect on the development of the school over many years, we can only give our God the glory for all He has done. He alone deserves the praise

### What a Teacher!

GET - Head Of Department

Retirement From the Classroom but Never from My Passion

When I think back on my career as a teacher, I know that it was God's plan all along. We all at some time ask the question "What is my purpose in life?" In Isaiah 44:2 God tells us "I am your creator. You were in my care before you were born." God has always had a plan for me and looking back on my life it is very clear that he has been with me and brought special people into my life along the way.

As far back as 1962, my Grade 10 year, before most of your parents were born, I selected Biology as a matric subject and from the get go I was passionate about the subject. It just so happened that I absolutely adored my biology teacher, Mr Nel, who also was my gymnastics coach and my role model. He was responsible for me receiving provincial colours for gymnastics.

No surprise, in 1965 I enrolled at the Johannesburg Teacher's Training College and specialised in Physical Education and Biology. After my graduation, in 1968 I was appointed at Northview High school. The children were precocious and I hated my first year of teaching and wanted to leave but my father encouraged me to stay till the end of that year. And then God threw me a curved ball! One of the pupils in my Grade 8 registration class, Ian Bonner, was diagnosed with cancer of the eye and had to have it removed. It was my job to rehabilitate him back into school life. I then realised what my role in education was, besides teaching the curriculum.

I taught at Northview for two years and returned to my old school in Pietersburg, Capricorn High School where I taught Physical Education and Biology for 5 years. I was fully involved in coaching all the sports, particularly athletics, and I went on to become a national high jump coach and achieved my own provincial colours for netball. The next part of my journey took me to Harare, Zimbabwe, where I taught Afrikaans at the same school that my grandmother had taught at. It was not long before I returned to Johannesburg and I was appointed at Sir John Adamson High School where I taught for 41 years. In that time, I taught Physical Education to all the girls in the school, became involved in leadership camps and became a Head of Department. That is where I met my friend Mrs Ansie Nel. So, you see, it is no surprise that she came to teach at Calvary years later. I have never let age dictate my life and at the age of 41 God blessed me with a daughter, Nicola.

My passion in Biology led me to study further in Zoology and Botany and I was appointed to teach senior Biology (Life Sciences) a venture in which I achieved great success and was awarded 2nd place at the National Teaching Awards in 2012. In that time, I was privileged to teach a wonderful student, Elaine van Breda, and that is when I first met Pastor John and Aunty Linda, her parents.

In those years I was a marker for matric Biology and I met a teacher who became a friend of mine, Libby Fenton, who later taught at Calvary Christian College. In 2015 I retired from teaching at Sir John Adamson High School but was not ready to give up my passion for teaching. Libby organised an interview for me at Calvary and when I met with Pastor John I smiled because I realised that it was part of God's plan for me to teach at this school. I was appointed to teach Afrikaans and my first year at Calvary was a huge challenge. I was new to the school, I had a naughty registration class and I really did not have enough experience to teach Afrikaans but challenges motivated me to do my best and I worked very hard. My efforts were rewarded with my appointment as the Head of Department of the Senior Phase. Teaching at Calvary was like a breath of fresh air compared to teaching at the government school. The classes were smaller and the pupils were polite. Covid brought its own challenges. I am 'Old School' and computers and technology terrorised me but I took the challenge head on. This was not going to beat me! In the last quarter of 2021, the school needed a senior Life Sciences teacher and I was approached to consider the job. I had to think about it but my passion for Life Sciences encouraged me to accept the challenge. I was back in the laboratory and was happy to be there!

This year I turned 75 and have decided to hang up the chalk after 54 years of devoting my life to education, and the thousands of young people that I have taught. I owe it to my husband, who has always given me the freedom to enjoy my passion, to be at home with him. He is not well and is in end stage kidney failure. I also owe it to myself to enjoy the last few years of my life with my family and friends, my hobbies and my garden! My passion for education will never wane and I can look back at a job well done. I have realised that I should not measure my success by the number of distinctions that my students have achieved over the years but by the number of pupils, colleagues or parents whose hearts I have touched or positively influenced in some way. Through my story you can see the web of connections between the people who have been in my life and how they have played a part in God's plan for me. As I take leave of you, I would like to share some of my principles:

- Love and care for people.
- Be faithful to those that are close to you.
- Honour your commitments.
- Work hard and meet deadlines to be successful.
- Follow your heart but have realistic goals to avoid disappointment.
- Remember the people who have influenced your life.
- Above all, love your God with all your heart and trust in him.

I wish Calvary great success in the building and development of the new high school. I shall be watching the progress and its growth. I wish all at this school great success and happiness. Thank you for the privilege of knowing you all and for allowing me to share my passion.

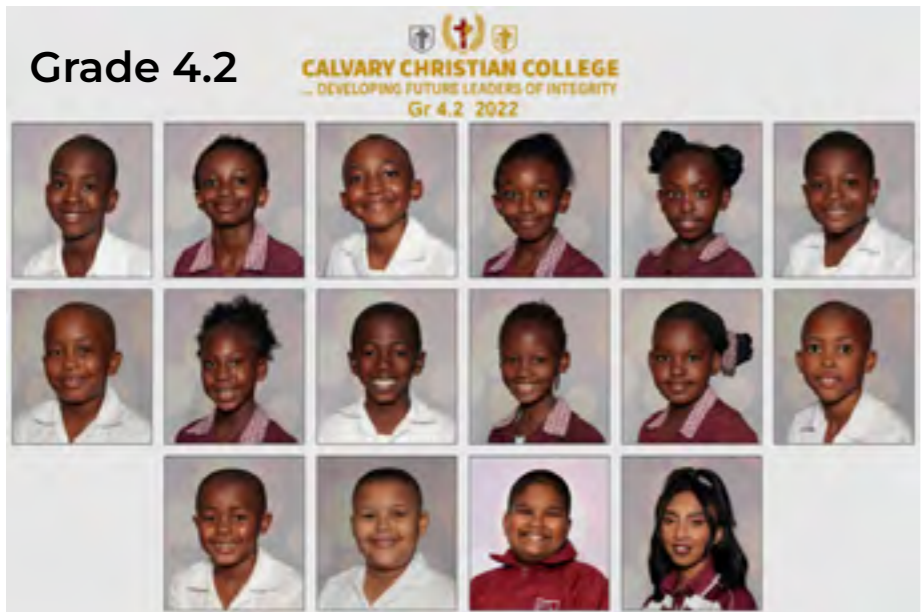

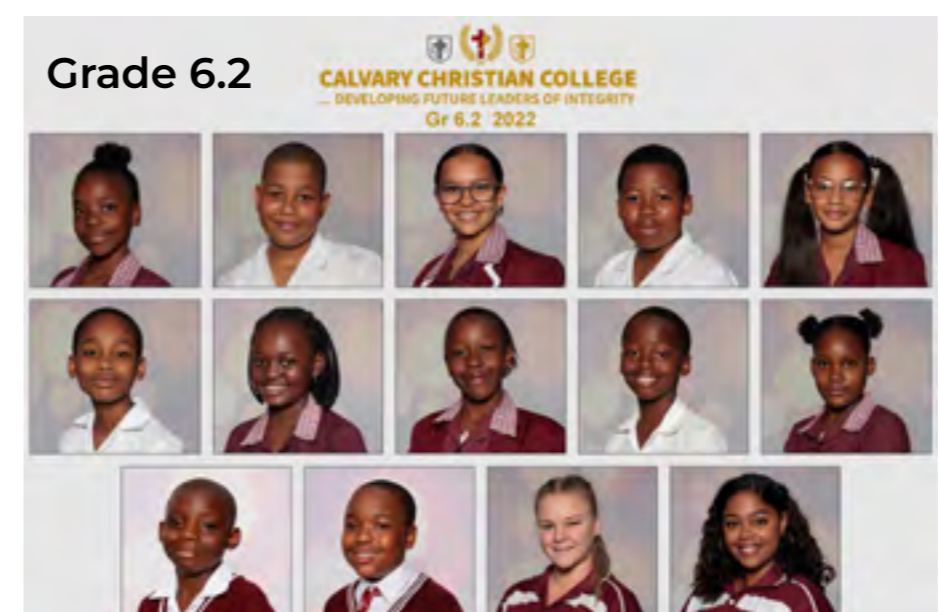

## The World In The Year 1600

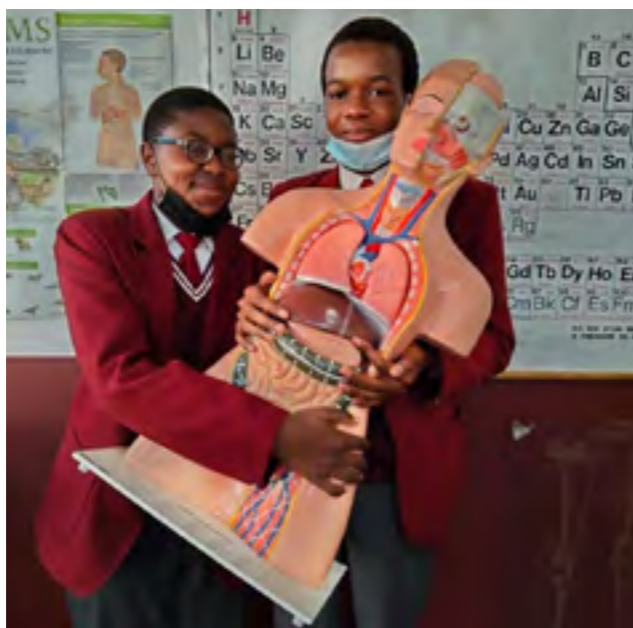
The 1600's was a time of great change in the world. Trade and expansion dominated almost all societies and great empires flourished in both Asia and Africa. This included the Ming in China, the Songhai Empire (the Gold Coast) in Africa and the Indian Mughal Empire. These empires produced art, literature and made significant inventions that we take for granted today. The Ming Empire was large and controlled most of Asia at one point. Ruling from 1368-1644, the Ming Dynasty impacted Chinese history. The Chinese also invented printing, paper and gunpowder and they also had advanced navigation instruments. They were known for expanding trade to the outside world which established cultural ties with the West. The Ming Dynasty is also remembered for its drama, literature and world-renowned porcelain.

The 4th "empire" was made up of the European societies. European societies underwent significant changes that were later to shift the balance of world power in favour of Europe. Ming China, the Songhai and Mughal Empire were 'advanced societies' technologically and scientifically. However, these three empires collapsed due to invasions and revolts - the Mongols invaded The Ming, a Moroccan army invaded Songhai and Emperor Nader Shah's empire invaded the Mughal empire. In contrast, Europe in the Middle Ages was dominated by the church and the land-owning nobility and grew in strength once the merchant class became dominant, weakening the power of the church. Later the merchant-driven quest for new markets eventually led to the colonization of Africa, China and India.

## From Berry Plant to Berry Harvesting

"From the moment the bus passed through the tunnel, I felt my farmer side coming to life" Katlego Sethosa, Grade 11 Geography Learner.

On the 1st of March 2022, Grade 9 learners along with all the geography learners from Grade 10-12, went on a Trip to The Field Berry Farm about 18km away from our school. At the Field Berry farm, there were a couple of activities lined up for us. We sat through a very educational presentation about the berry farm explaining the berry process from a little plant all the way to it being a manufactured product in the shelves of stores. These final berry products include, jams, Juices, Ice teas, beers and ice-cream, syrup, wine, sweets etc. We also learnt about the benefits of eating berries

Raspberries are high in anti-oxides, prevents cells from aging, helps fight against cancer, reduces fats in the body etc. Following that we had a question-and-answer session with the owner of the Farm, Aunty Lungi. She was quite impressed and felt challenged as the first-time learners had come to the farm very eagerly to learn and ask intelligent questions.

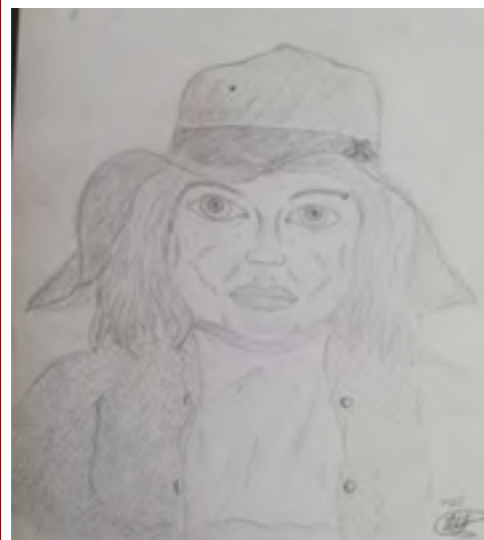
Art is one of the few places where different abilities are explored. As we include art history, learners are exposed to admirable artists both modern and historical. Next year we will be focusing on South Africa artists.

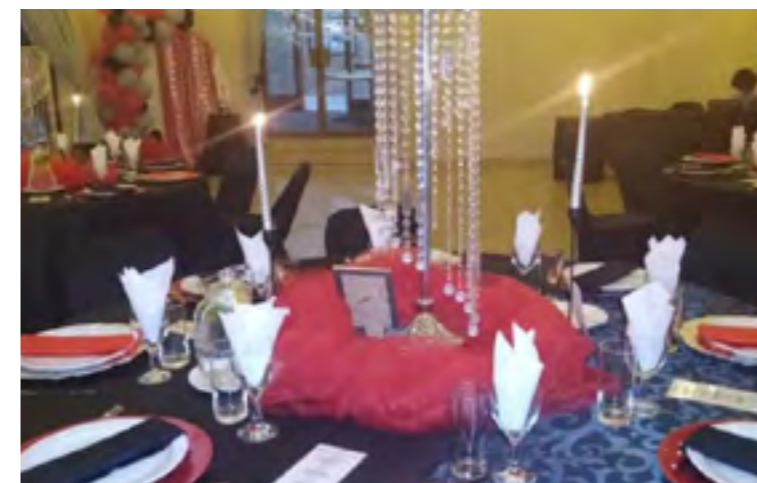
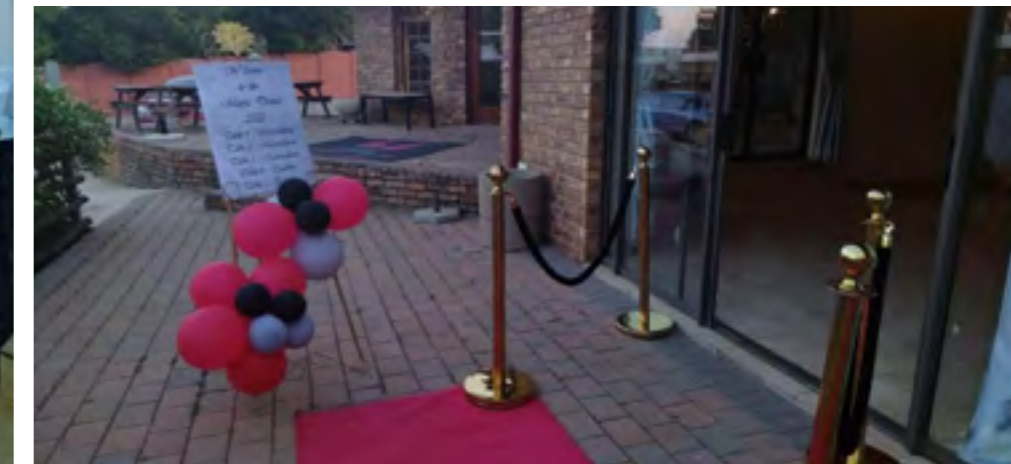
